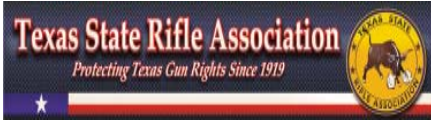

The Feds, Media, & Science Don't Fit

Do you remember in 2002 the massive publicity given to a study saying that menopausal hormones, progesterin and estrogen, substantially increased a woman's risk of heart attack? The study was so conclusive the Federal Government through the National Institutes of Health stopped the study before it was completed to warn the public. These hormones were killing American women!

Stop. Now, have you seen any headlines saying the study was wrong?

Menopausal women and their doctors and families were shocked in 2002 when a supposed authoritative study was proved that menopausal women taking hormone therapy had a much greater chance of death. This was big news, patients were told to call their doctor, and the study was so convincing many women stopped taking their meds cold turkey before seeing their physician. This study scared a whole generation of women.

Now we find out that the National Institutes of Health officials over-generalized the data and excluded many of the study's own investigators and physicians from the first review. Many of the investigators who spent nearly a decade working on the study had no input in the final paper.

We will also be awarding James Cribbs with the ARC Honorary Lifetime Membership, for his outstanding contributions to the Club and the Republican community throughout the years.

Tarrant County District 96 Representative Bill Zedler on the 80th Seesion

The 80th session of the Texas Legislature accomplished much for our state. We passed a fiscally-sound budget, with a growth in spending LESS than the growth of inflation and population. The \$150 billion, 2-year budget meets Texas priorities by fully funding Medicaid and CHIP and increasing funding for education. The budget also leaves money unspent, exercising the same fiscal discipline that Texas families do by putting aside money for the future. It includes \$14 million above what was already set aside to buy down property taxes. We provided historic property tax relief, and extended those benefits to elderly and disabled homeowners. We also put \$2.5 billion into the state's Rainy Day Fund.

Education remained a legislative priority and we passed several bills to better prepare students for higher

education and the workforce. We also established the Texas Tomorrow Fund 2 to assist parents with the expense of higher education. State parks received long-term funding and issues at the Texas Youth Commission were addressed.

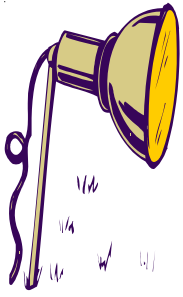
Personally, 33 bills I authored or co-authored were ultimately passed. I am proud to be the only Tarrant County representative, and one of only 15 lawmakers named a "Texas Taxpayer Hero." I voted against every tax increase and any expansion of gambling, while supporting photo ID for voters, and defending the lives of unborn Texans. I supported Jessica's Law to protect children from sexually violent predators and the expansion of religious freedom in Texas public schools.

While we did pass a border security bill, I am disappointed more



immigration-related bills did not become law, including my bill to revoke in-state tuition for illegal aliens. While immigration is a federal issue, states must take action to ensure that federal immigration law is fully enforced. I will continue to work for immigration reform and removing incentives that encourage illegal behavior.

Overall, I am proud of the conservative accomplishments of the 80th Legislature, and it remains my high honor to serve District 96 in the Texas House of Representatives.

Five years after the study we now find out the real results. The initial study had too many older women that skewed the results. The science now shows that the timing of hormone use in menopausal women matters and that progestin and estrogen have a range of risks and benefits. Younger women appear to receive heart protection, while older women are more at risk. On the plus side, hormones may protect younger women's hearts and they definitely protect against hip fractures, and they lower the risk for diabetes and may even lower the risk for colon cancer.

On the negative side, menopause hormones do increase the risk for blood clots and stroke. Women who used both estrogen and progestin were at 24% higher risk for breast cancer. But women who regularly use estrogen *without* progestin had a 33% lower risk of breast cancer.

The media made a mistake in not questioning the study in 2002 and the Feds for prematurely releasing the data without input from all involved. What's the moral of the story? Don't believe everything you hear. Have a good relationship with your physician. Be skeptical the next time you hear a study saying coffee is going to kill you. Recent stories touted in the media say cigarette smoking has a protective affect against Alzheimer's disease and that overweight people are more likely to survive a heart attack than thin people. I guess we should all smoke and be fat! And certainly don't trust the media headlines when they try to scare every person in America. Can we now talk about global warming?

James Cribbs To Be Awarded ARC Honorary Lifetime Membership



If they're not careful, even attorneys working the other side of the fence from barrister James Cribbs can be caught up in an admiring glow for this master litigator's wit, wisdom, and well-placed mix of humorous asides and satirical barbs. A Southern-style orator, it's easy to see where he's both most comfortable and proficient when pacing the rail in front of a balky jury.

He's also been a true Republican stalwart, flying his colors as such in Arlington back when the dominant polical trait in both the city and the state were more in favor of Yellow Dog-you-know-whats. He was an early president of the Arlington Republican Club in 1977 and since then has been tapped frequently for critical state GOP functions. He was member of the Republican State Executive Committee from 1978 through 1991, chairing the Resolutions Committee at the Texas Republican Convention in 1988.

Cribbs was selected as a delegate to the Republican National Convention in 1984, and served as a Republican appointee to the Texas State Ethics Commission from 1992 to 1996.

Equally respected at the local level, Cribbs is a past president of the Arlington Bar Association, a past chairman of the Tarrant County Bar Fee Arbitration Committee and a current member of the Texas Bar Foundation, as well as being recognized by the University of Texas at Arlington as a distinguished alumni. The Arlington native also served in the Air Force as a lieutenant and judge advocate.

Education Board Chief Named

Governor Rick Perry announced the appointment Tuesday, 7/17/07, of Donald McLeroy for Chief of the SBOE. One of 15 elected members of the board, [he] replaces Rep. Geraldine Miller of Dallas. She retains her position on the board but is prevented by term limits from continuing as chairwoman, a spokeswoman for the Texas Education Agency said.

"The governor believes that Don McLeroy is the right person to lead the SBOE—he is a man of principle and conviction, and the governor has full confidence that he will do a great job," Perry spokesman Robert Black said.

But the director of the Texas Freedom Network, which opposes religious conservatives in government, said that McLeroy has voted to water-down evolution theory in textbooks and has led the panel into divisive and unnecessary battles over cultural issues.

"Texas parents should be troubled that the governor has appointed as head of the state board a clear ideologue who has repeatedly put his own personal and political agendas ahead of sound science, good health, and solid textbooks for students," said Kathy Miller, president of the Texas Freedom Network.

McLeroy, who could not be reached for comment Tuesday, was elected to the SBOE in November 1998 and re-elected in 2002. His term as chairman expires Feb. 1, 2009. He is a dentist and former trustee of the Bryan school district, according to information from the governor's office.

The board's members are elected by voters, but the chairperson is selected by the governor. The board sets policy for Texas public schools.

Minutes of the 06-28-07 ARC Meeting by Lisa Callaghan, Secretary

The President called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM. All board Members were present. The president then turned the meeting over to Laraine Bethke, V.P.-Programs. Lisa Callaghan, Secretary, read last month's minutes. They were approved and adopted. Anne Coker, V.P. Membership, reported that we had 193 dues paid members. Dale Attebery, Treasurer, gave the Treasurer's Report. The Treasurer's Report was approved and adopted. Dr. Mark Hanson, Legislative Alert reported on the failure of the Immigration Bill before Congress. He also reported on the Castle doctrine, Emergency Powers Act, and the Religious Freedoms Protection Bill. He pointed out that in the Texas Legislature there had been no pro-life legislation this session and no further appropriations legislation.

Under the heading of Old Business, Ralph Sobel announced that the new date for the ARC Golf Tournament will be 9-24-07 and that anyone interested in sponsoring or working as a volunteer at the Tournament should see him after the meeting. David Cook gave the Reclaim District 93 Committee report.

Under the heading of New Business, the election of Nominating Committee members will take place next month. State Representative Diane Patrick made a presentation thanking the club for helping the area stay focused on Republican issues, and presented the club officers with a Resolution thanking them for their efforts. Laraine Bethke reminded club members to have a photo taken for the Club directory. Elected Officials, precinct chairs, and candidates were introduced.

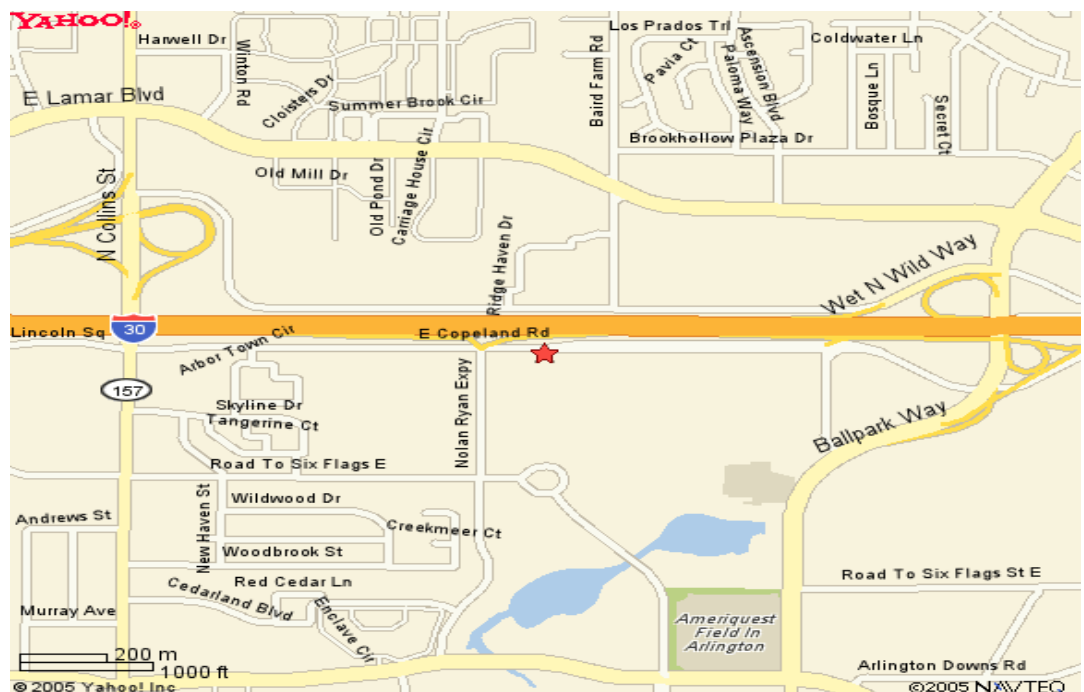
Laraine Bethke then introduced the speaker, Mr. James Spaniolo, President of the University of Texas at Arlington. Mr. Spaniolo has been President of UTA for 3 years. He pointed out that the recent legislative session was remarkable for UTA. He said UTA started with a \$16M deficit, but that a lot of people worked to change that situation. Senator Chris Harris and Senator Kim Brimer and Representative Diane Patrick were recognized for their hard work in accomplishing the task. He pointed out that there was a new formula for funding higher education in place, which would be phased in over three sessions. He described the new state-of-the-art Engineering Research Building they are building on the UTA campus. He discussed the new UTA Planetarium. He handed out free Planetarium tickets to club members. He described the campus itself, indicating that there were 4500 students living on campus, and that they have over 300 student organizations. He noted that on August 24, 2007 they will be opening a "Smart Hospital" where nursing students can do their training.

The date of the Club's next meeting, July 26, 2007 was announced. The guest speaker was announced to be State Board of Education Chairman Geraldine "Tincy" Miller, who will speak on "An Update on Public Education." Pat Hardy, a State Board of Education District 11 Member, will also speak. Additionally, the Club will honor Mr. James Cribbs as its 2007 Lifetime Member. The meeting was then adjourned.

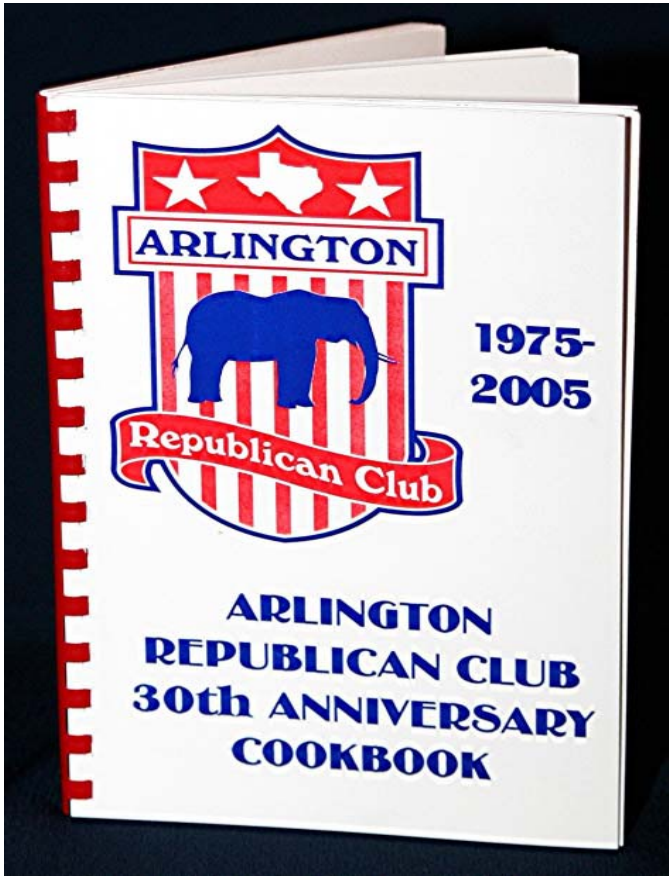
