Legislative Update

In financing and regulating public education, the concept of "local control" has been a sacred philosophy in Texas.

With many examples of the waste and abuse that this philosophy produced, many of us believed that some restraint was necessary.

The House Bill 2 by Kent Grusendorf solved the problem in the following way:

First, the bill demands full disclosure of local school budgets.

The bill requires detailing which part of each item goes to the classroom. Part of the law requires that 65% of the money goes to the classroom.

This information was mandated not only to the school boards, but also to the public.

Additionally, school boards will be elected in November when voter interest is high, instead of an unusual day.

The revenue bill, which is House Bill 3, would also decrease your ad valorem taxes-at least the school portion thereof.

Mark's Remarks

Justice O'Connor-Good Bye and Good Riddance

The retirement of Justice Sandra Day O'Connor is a wonderful thing for conservatives. I have to say good bye and good riddance. Before she was confirmed she told the Senate committee she was anti abortion, and of course as soon as she was on the Court she changed her stripes and consistently voted for the genocide of abortion. Just another example of what you see is not what you get. Over the past few years she's been one of the current Justices wanting to consider foreign law in the interpretation of our laws.

I certainly hope that President Bush doesn't disappoint us and appoint a namby pamby Republican jurist who is acceptable to the left. He has a real chance to appoint a real conservative to the court. I hope he appoints a non judge, and (heaven forbid!) a non lawyer. There is no Constitutional requirement for a law school graduate to be on the Supreme Court. We don't need someone who over analyzes basic law to see penumbras that aren't there and wants to make their clerks happy and get a nice profile written about them in the New York Times. We don't want someone who considers what the Washington Post says and what their "friends" say to them at the DC cocktail party circuit.

It sure seems to me that the current group on the Supreme Court has never even read the Constitution. The recent decision by the Supremes in the eminent domain case is just further proof. In a recent Wall Street Journal editorial, Robert Bork, who should be on the Court, said: "Consider just a few of the Court's accomplishments: The justices have weakened the authority of other institutions, public and private, such as schools, businesses and

churches; assisted in sapping the vitality of religion through a transparently false interpretation of the establishment clause; denigrated marriage and family; destroyed taboos about vile language in public; protected as free speech the basest pornography, including computer-simulated child pornography; weakened political parties and permitted prior restraints on political speech, violating the core of the First Amendment's guarantee of freedom of speech; created a right to abortion virtually on demand, invalidating the laws of all 50 states; whittled down capital punishment, on the path, apparently, to abolishing it entirely; mounted a campaign to normalize homosexuality, culminating soon, it seems obvious, in a right to homosexual marriage; permitted racial and gender discrimination at the expense of white males; and made the criminal justice system needlessly slow and complex, tipping the balance in favor of criminals." Bush should appoint Bork to the Supreme Court! No wonder why Ted Kennedy wouldn't confirm him, he makes too much sense!

We need a justice who does not believe in *stare decisis*, the practice of following judicial prior precedents instead of re examining the merits anew each time a decision is made. *Stare Decisis* is Latin for "to stand by that which is decided." *Stare Decisis* is the reason bad decisions are not overturned. The Supreme Court, being a human institution, can't admit it could be wrong. So it continually uses its mistaken precedents as a basis for new rulings. The only justice who ignores *stare decisis* is Justice Thomas. (The appointment of Justice Thomas may be the best thing the first President Bush has ever done.)

Imagine if your doctor used *stare decisis*. Because of the way treatment was once done, we should never change. If new medications or medical procedures are invented or

discovered, we should never use them because it upsets what we did in the past. We can't admit that what we did in the past was wrong so we won't change! What should happen to this doctor? The state medical board would certainly investigate this and he or she could lose his license. He'd eventually be sued successfully for malpractice. Hmm. Maybe our judges should be disciplined and sued for malpractice.

If it appears I am mad at our federal judiciary you would be correct. It's a renegade branch of government. Thomas Jefferson said, "The opinion which gives to the judges the right to decide what laws are constitutional and what not, not only for themselves in their own sphere of action but for the Legislature and Executive also in their spheres, would make the Judiciary a despotic branch."

One very resourceful arriving soldier had even made arrangements to propose to his girlfriend and, yes, she said yes! While gestures of appreciation pale in comparison to the sacrifices these young men and women make, hopefully the soldiers feel the immense gratitude and respect that people have for them by the demonstrations of support.

In addition to our daily prayers, you may want to consider how you might personally express gratitude. Troops arrive almost every day at DFW, including weekends. (By late July the arrivals will be at Terminal D, but as this goes to press they are still at Terminal B, Gate 39. The flights usually arrive around 8:30 in the morning.) You may want to visit www.welcometroops.com or simply call Christene Wheeler at 972-621-0400 (per the website) to get more information. If you want to just show up, you can call 972-574-0392 for a recorded message that will alert you for the arrival time for that day (as the times do fluctuate). DFW Airport even validates the parking of those who are there to welcome the troops! Additionally you may want to consider donating some of your frequent flier miles so that family members can more easily visit injured soldiers at military hospitals. Congress has recently improved some of the flight benefits for soldiers on R&R, but there is still a need for miles. Please visit www.heromiles.com. (Most major airlines have excellent programs to help in this area.) Finally, please visit www.fisherhouse.org for other ideas for helping the troops. (Be sure and type in ".org" vs. ".com" to get to the right site.

SREC Report

Upon Sandra Day O'Connor's recent retirement, the speculation started on who would replace her. This is a vacancy those of us who have toiled in the trenches have longed for.

Much speculation originally fell on Attorney General Alberto Gonzales. Although his age (49) and ethnicity and life story is attractive, his views on parent consent on abortion and the need to recuse himself on many potential cases is troublesome as a nominee.

Ted Olson would be outstanding, but his age (64) would not allow as long a tenure as others and his past in the Election 2000 controversy would cause a fierce confirmation fight.

There are many appeals court judges who would make fine choices, but their relative obscurity would expose them to the danger of the media defining them before the people get to know them. Emilio Garza and Janice Rogers Brown are personal favorites and either would make a fine Chief Justice when that time comes.

Which brings me to another candidate. A pro-life, pro-property rights conservative who spent most of his career as a Judge not a legislator. A person well known to members of the Senate because he is one of them. He is 53 years old, so he could have a lasting impact. It would be hard for the Senate not to confirm one of their own, because they would have to live with him in the Senate for three more years if they did not. He is our Senator John Cornyn.

The political advantages are considerable. It would allow Governor Perry to name a new Senator upon confirmation. Henry Bonilla was already exploring a run if Senator Hutchison had not chosen to seek reelection. This could mean

that the 2nd and 4th most populated states would have Hispanic Republican Senators. It would be good for our ticket to have a South Texas Hispanic toward the top our ticket and would stretch the Democrats resources thin trying to run candidates for two US Senate seats as well as Governor.

When we win the first Supreme Court battle, the second and third vacancies become easier to accomplish. John Cornyn may be the best way to win that first important confirmation fight.

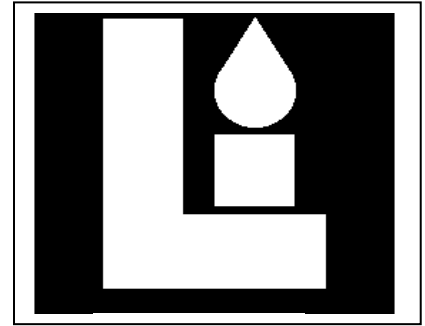

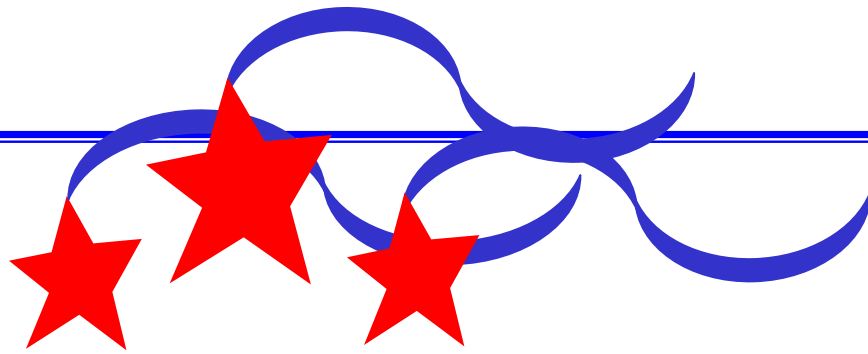

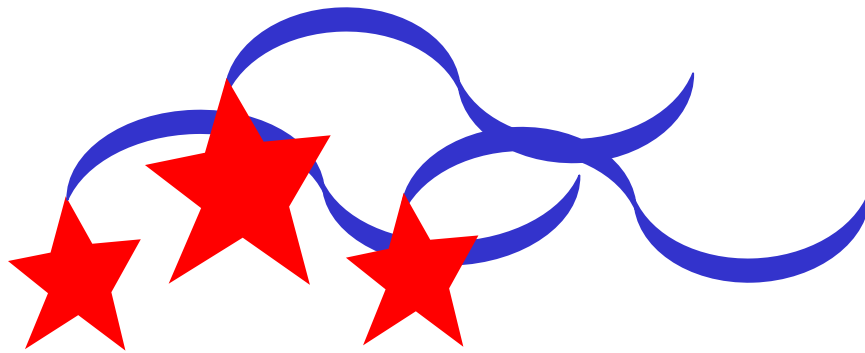
